Cottage Grove's Robert Turner premieres work at Carnegie Hall

MANHATTAN, New York — On March 13, Robert Turner and the Linfield University Concert Choir performed on the famed Carnegie Hall stage in Midtown Manhattan. Together with choirs from Baylor University and Bridgewater State University, the nearly 200-voice National Masterwork Chorus performed the world premiere of Andrea Ramsey's composition, "The Wilderness of You."

Turner is a 2024 Cottage Grove graduate majoring in theatre arts at Linfield University.

Ramsey is an award-winning composer with over 150 works to date. In "The Wilderness of You," Ramsey adapted Jarod K. Anderson's naturalist and perspective-shifting poetry in an approximately 25-minute work. The piece pulls listeners toward the things people most have in common: human bodies' inner workings and wonder.

One choir member described the moment as "a surreal experience," reflecting the deep emotional and artistic impact of performing in such a legendary setting.
